Secure attachment is associated with higher grades and standardized test scores compared to insecure attachment. Secure attachment is also associated with greater emotional regulation, social competence, and willingness to take on challenges, and with lower levels of ADHD and delinquency, each of which in turn is associated with higher achievement.

The most significant and well-researched theory that supported this research was attachment theory (Bowlby, 1969, 1973, 1980) and when the research data were analysed, attachment theory was the framework used to examine the behaviour of the children and so linked early experiences of care to experience of difficulties in school. The research exposed the links between differing patterns of attachment and behaviour and responses in the classroom, to the teacher and to the task.
